- 1. Report Back from SLDS Strategies for Engagement Workshop attendees: Geri DelaCruz (DGM), Eugene Tebuteb (DOL), Tracy Norita (DOF)
- Engagement (SLDS) is the process by which those leading SLDS work involve the groups that contribute to and are served by the SLDS.
- Highlighted the SLDS Engagement Toolkit (available via Communities 360).



POLICY	PROCESS	
"What" and "Why"	"How"	
 Sets the RULES and GUIDELINES Focus on principles and expectations Scope is usually broad and overarching Usually applies to everyone within the organization. 	 Describes HOW the policy is implemented step-by-step Focus on procedures, methods, or workflows required to carry out tasks in alignment with the policy Should be specific and detailed Usually applies to those directly responsible to implement the process 	
Example: "Only authorized personnel should have access to data being transferred from the partner source to the SLDS warehouse."	Example: "Authorization requests shall be submitted to the Data Governance Manager for approval 10 days prior to access."
